Visitors were greeted with the sounds and fragrances of the holiday season (Christmas music and clove pine cones), along with hundreds of delicious and beautiful cookies. We also had freshly dried herbs in jars for sale from the Farmhouse's own herb garden, thanks to board member Bonnie Tesson, who tends our herb garden.

Sutter-Meyer Society Joins Forces with Historic St. Louis

In 2018, the Sutter-Meyer Society joined forces with a larger organization, Historic Saint Louis. The organization is "an effort to combine local historic museums, sites and privately owned homes together to create a larger impact within our community." Currently, about 26 historic entities are members of the organization. There are monthly meetings to share ideas and to acquaint members with the other properties. Some of the more recent meetings have taken place at the Gittemeier House in Florissant, White Haven in Afton, the Chatillon-DeMenil Mansion near south Broadway and the Field House Museum downtown. To date, the organization has been involved with three joint events, all of which have been well received in the greater St. Louis Community. The most recent event was "A Spirited Holiday Past," a major open house on December 7. Future events for this group include a Trivia Night to be held Friday, January 24, at Crestwood Community Center. Also, for the second year, there will be an event (to be held June 6) focusing on garden tours at historic houses.

The Sutter-Meyer Farmhouse has greatly benefited from its membership in this organization through the networking it provides. The increased publicity we have received has led to new people visiting the Farmhouse. The Farmhouse also has received a few new items as a result of our membership. So far, this has been a win/win experience that we plan to continue.
